Historian to Speak About 1906 Quake at April 9 Meeting

- **10:30 AM – Business Meeting:** All members are encouraged to participate in the Business Meeting. There's no need to RSVP for the Business Meeting – just show up!
- **12:00 Noon – Lunch and Speaker:** Richard G. Torney, a member of the Board of Directors of the Kentfield-Greenbrae Historical Society, is our speaker for the April 9 lunch. He will discuss little-known aspects of the 1906 San Francisco earthquake and fire.

In addition to the loss of lives and damage to buildings and infrastructure from the disaster, the threat of contagious disease loomed as displaced people were

forced to live outdoors without access to water and sanitation. U.S. Army Surgeon Lieutenant Colonel George Henry Torney was named San Francisco Chief Sanitation Officer two days after the quake. One of Torney's sons roamed the city, photographing the devastation. His photos have been rediscovered and will be shown during the talk. Our speaker is a great-grandson of the S.F. Chief Sanitation Officer credited with averting an epidemic.
