March 8 to Be Our First Potluck in 2 Years!

Speaker: Founder and Executive Director of 'Enriching Lives through Music'

Potluck at CM Community Center

The March 8 meeting will be our first potluck luncheon in two years. Our speaker is Jane Kramer, founder and executive director of Enriching Lives through Music (ELM), a



full-scholarship, multi-year, intensive program that provides music education, ensemble, and performance opportunities to underserved youth.

Programs include chorus, orchestra, chamber music, and parent music groups. In addition to school-year classes, ELM runs a summer camp and concert series, and provides scholarships for private lessons for exceptionally motivated students. There are no financial barriers to participation.

Jane Kramer is an accomplished musician (oboe and French horn) with a Ph.D. in Urban Policy and Planning from UC Berkeley. A grant from Vassar College in 2008 led her to create an after-school music program at Bahia Vista Elementary School in San Rafael, starting with 15 recorders and a small group of volunteers. Fourteen years later, the music program is 400 members strong. In 2016 she received the Marin County Humanitarian Award and in 2018 she was inducted into the Marin Women's Hall of Fame.


