Dr. Brett Geithman has served as Larkspur-Corte Madera School District's Superintendent since 2017. He will present recent district achievements, programs supported by the community, and goals for the future.

His career as an educator began as an elementary school teacher and he also taught at the secondary level in alternative settings. In 2009, he earned his doctorate from USC, where his dissertation focused on growth models to determine teacher and school effectiveness.

He has focused much of his career on personalized learning and on bringing researched best practices into the classroom. He believes all children can learn at high level and has

collaborated with Dr. Jo Boaler of Stanford University on a grades 5-12 mathematics study on growth mindset.

He and his wife, Kristy, are proud parents of two Hall Middle School students.
