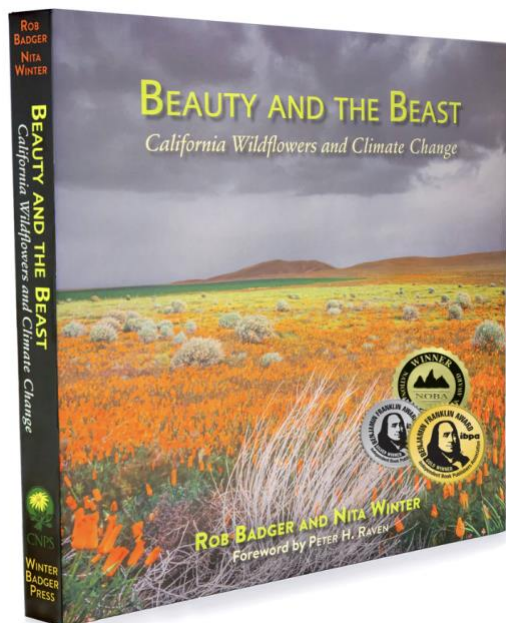

Be sure to attend our month meeting on Tuesday, February 14 at noon. Internationally acclaimed conservation photographers Rob Badger and Nita Winter will take CMWIC members behind the scenes of their 27-year journey photographing wildflowers and "superblooms" throughout California and the West.



Their work has been featured in *Time*, *Mother Jones*, and *Sierra* magazines, and in *The New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *San Francisco Chronicle*, and *Los Angeles Times*.

Their book, "*Beauty and the Beast: California Wildflowers and Climate Change*," documents their travels near and far to record wildflowers where they naturally occur, in natural light, and without doing harm.

A recipient of the Sierra Club's Ansel Adams Award for Conservation Photography, the book has been called "a delight for the eyes

and nourishment for the soul.” It will be available for sale at our February meeting for \$60 by cash, check, or credit card.
